Kaiako Roster

In recent months you may have noticed a few changes to who is here on a day to day basis. We know that for some tamariki it is important to know in advance who is onboard each day. Currently, Riana and Tenaya are here every day, Jim works Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and Maddy does not work Thursdays. Josh covers Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Kaiako who are present each day are written up daily on the whiteboard at the entrance.

KEL Annual General Meeting - 30 April 2025

Our AGM for the year has been scheduled for Wednesday evening the 30th April at 7.30 pm at KEL. At the meeting we hope to have a new entrant teacher from a local school to talk with whānau about School Readiness for tamariki who are about to start school.

Annual reports will be presented, and a proposed budget for the 2025/2026 year. We will also elect the Governance Committee for the year ahead. KEL is an incorporated society governed by a committee of parents. The committee determines and develops the centre's strategic direction, reviews our policies and procedures on a regular basis, employs and supports our kaiako and generally keeps the centre on task.

The committee meets once every six weeks. By becoming a committee member, you can play an important role in shaping the early learning experience of your tamariki and help ensure that decisions made by the committee are in the interests of all tamariki who attend KEL.

Fundraising for our outdoor area

This year the KEL committee has been doing some thinking about ways we can fundraise to help fund some cool projects for our awesome centre.

One of these projects is our outside play area. This has been a major focus for our committee over the last year and more. We began by removing the tree which dominated the area and created lots of work for our kaiako, sweeping up leaves and flowers and seeds – all year round. We replaced the space the tree took up with a bark chip area and then we replaced the fence. Thanks to Fred Double (KEL whānau) for building the Bark Chip Pit and to all those KEL whānau who helped to make these first stages happen – including the grant applications. Thanks also to the Wellington Community Trust and the TG Macarthy Trust for providing us with grants to cover some of the costs so far.

Now! we want to move to the next stage -revamping the rest of the area and replacing the safety matting. This will cost money!

Information:

Teacher Only Day

Monday 23 June

KEL will be **closed** for our Teacher Only Day on the **Monday 23**rd **June**. On this day kajako will be focusing on:

Strengthening their knowledge of Te Ao Māori in particular 'Kaitiakitanga'. This will be the foundation for their next Centre Inquiry - what does this look like for them as teachers and learners. There will also be time spent on the day on making resources, recycle, upcycle and reuse – linking back to kaitiakitanga.

IMPORTANT! Reminders:

Illnesses

If your tamaiti is not well, please keep them at home to prevent the spread of illness and infection at the centre.

Advise us of absences and illnesses

Please let us know if your tamaiti is going to be absent. We also want to know if your tamaiti is sick. Please let us know their symptoms so that we can protect everyone at KEL

Text or email is our preferred method of communication for absences.

Nappies and wipes

Please remember to check your supply.

Naming items

Things are easily lost at KEL over the course of a busy day. Best practice is to name everything and keep precious toys at home.

Wet bags

Thank you to those who have provided wet bags for your tamariki, as we no longer have a supply of plastic bags these are a real help for messy/wet clothing.

Emergency kit snack boxes

We are wanting each whānau to provide us with a 2-litre ice cream container with snacks you know your tamaiti will eat, and medication such as inhalers for them. These must have a Drs label on it which shows expiry date and dosage. These will need to be turned over every 6 months.

Signing in and out

Remember to sign in and out when you are dropping off and picking up. For safety reasons we need to know who is on the premises at all times during the day.

Confirmation of enrolment forms

Occasionally we ask whānau to <u>confirm</u> that they want their tamaiti to continue to attend KEL for their booked hours. This is because if tamaiti have been absent for a period or show irregular attendance, the Ministry of Education requires that we ask whānau to sign a form to confirm their booked days/hours. **Thank you!** to those whānau for supporting the Centre to comply with this MoE requirement.
