Winter ills

Please do not bring your child to the Centre when they are not well. Sick children need the chance to rest and recuperate. We do not have the facilities to care for sick children.

A number of Centre children have had colds recently. To reduce the chance of infecting others, please keep your child at home until their nose discharge clears. Children who have had stomach bugs need to be kept away from the Centre until a period of at least 48 hours has passed since the last time they vomited or the last incidence of diarrhoea.

Please ask the teachers for information about exclusion periods for other infectious illnesses, or see our Health and Wellness Policy on the notice board.
